Club Member Car of the Month - 1993 MG RV8



This month's featured car is owned by Julian Drew

hy an RV8? Well, I've always had a passion for motor cars & things mechanical for as long as I can remember and in 1987 when leaving school, I took up a mechanical apprenticeship with Hartwell's of Bath to become a vehicle technician.

This took me through my apprentice years and onto further qualification with Rover Cars as Master Technician in 1993.

I went through the MG saloon days with Metro's, Maestro's & Montego's so became quite attached to the brand. My mother and father had several two seaters back before I was born and a Magnette saloon when I was rather young, so only a very few distant memories of that last car along with an MG Montego in the nineties. Roll onto 1993 and our Dealership in Bath became an appointed dealer for the launch of the MG RV8. I remember that this required a dedicated technician for the service & maintenance side of things. As Master Technician I don't think I needed to put my hand up for this but at the time I do remember showing some very keen levels of interest!

In the early 1990's a lot of the vehicle product was starting to see significant electrical systems being fitted within the cars, fuel injection, engine management systems & internal electrical systems were becoming quite prominent on most models. Seems quite some way away from today's modern vehicles, however, even back then we were experiencing a big shift. I was in my twenties and with a rather senior workforce found myself at the front of all this modern technology for the time, as others felt more comfortable with traditional mechanical work.

RV8 has a real blend of vehicle systems with electronics from Metro's, Rover 200's, 800's a fuel injection system as used on Land Rover and Range Rover vehicles, not to mention a little Porsche and Vauxhall, so quite the mixed bag.

To become more familiar with the vehicle before launch I spent a few days at Cowley with



the training school & production team, which very much supported my interest with the model.

However, as most will know the large majority of the RV8's produced were exported to Japan & as such quite a low volume remained in the UK. Which didn't dent my enthusiasm for the vehicle.

Wind on some twenty-five years & with the family getting a little older I found the opportunity to finally get my hands on one. A significant number of the exported vehicles

had made their way back to the UK and the very familiar colour of Woodcoat green being the rather dominant colour on these returning cars.

I bought my first RV8 in one of these colours, not my favourite, but a nice colour all the same. The car itself was OK, a kind of test the water car, would the novelty wear off etc. Well, the novelty certainly didn't wear off!

What I really wanted now was a UK car in British Racing green. Well, that turned up which ended up being car number two. Wind on a further 18 months & another British racing Green UK one turns up low mileage, great history & ends up being the current number three car, which I have here.

Quite an early car off the production run & it retains mainly in standard form. I'm quite keen to keep the vehicle this way. Although, during the winter I refurbished the front suspension, power coating, replacing with poly bushes & fitting uprated shock absorbers. Does make the ride a little more compliant.

A fuel ECU performance chip & sports exhaust further compliment the car & not items that are too noticeable. I think a similar overhaul of the rear suspension at some time in the future, but other than that I'll keep the car as it is.

We have a few shows booked for this year, maybe the odd track day. We've already started to brave the top-down driving since January, ensuring we have a dry day, a few layers of clothing with Gemma ensuring a National Trust location is on hand to provide a warm coffee. Both our children Alfie & Jasmine also enjoy the car, Alfie's more akin to top down driving no matter what the weather, we just need to work on Jasmine for more of the top-down driving, but it's all great fun.

Great Bustard: 4%


Julia's House: 65%
