he last in our planned motoring trips away in 2023 was to Whittlebury Park, a hotel on the edge of the Northamptonshire village of Whittlebury. Our stay was coincident with the October club night and therefore we missed the "Would I lie To You" evening.

Because of the hotel's close proximity to the Silverstone Circuit it is themed on the history of Grand Prix Racing, the various restaurants and corporate spaces are named after race circuits such as Brooklands and Monza whilst the walls of the large main bar are adorned with memorabilia and photographs of past world champions.

Predictably some may say, one of the visits we made which may be of interest was to the recently opened - early 2020 - Silverstone Museum. Its had mixed reports, as with most destinations it can be expensive if you have a family in tow and the restaurant could be improved.

As to the museum itself? well it tells the story of the Silverstone site from its origins as an RAF operational Training Unit for Wellington bombers during WW2 through to the establishment of the airfield as a racing circuit and how Silverstone evolved into the "Home of British Motorsport"

There are many interactive displays to keep the troops interested and also examples of the cars and motorcycles that would have raced at Silverstone down the years.

Poignantly there was also an area where well known pre war racing drivers are remembered. Having signed up to fight and were killed in action or executed by the Nazis for spying.

As always keeping to the MG theme, this MG YB took part in the first Silverstone Daily Express International Trophy Production Touring Car race in 1952 - the event is recognised as the birth of Touring Car Racing. This car was first in class driven by Dick Kakobs - The overall winner was Stirling Moss of course.

And for the bikers amongst you. Barry Sheene rode this motorcycle as part of Texaco Heron Team Suzuki in the 1979 British Grand Prix. He and Kenny Roberts went toe to toe throughout the race with Barry losing out by 0.03 secs at the finish. Although he did win the Venezuelan, Swedish and French Grand Prix

Back in the summer my father had retired his MG3 to 'We Buy Any Car' and had bought a Toyota Yaris Hybrid which he was very happy with and my brother at about the same time had bought a new Honda HRV Hybrid - both of these are self-charging and do not require 'plugging in'. They were both really happy with their purchases so I thought maybe I would get a self-charging hybrid too and went to look at the MG range - well, that was

disappointing, all the MGs need to be plugged in.. So, I looked around and for about the same price of a new MGZS there wasn't much out there that I would be happy with. We have a big Honda CRV and so I looked at the Hondas and even the small Jazz was going to require more cash than I had. In the end we decided we could actually go 'small car' and with a chunk of the Magnette money a nearly new Yaris hybrid was in our price range so, that was what we went for. We now have a 2022 Yaris Hybrid in White as our everyday car and it is a great little car especially when you put it in 'power mode' when Nancy isn't watching... I also love the adaptive cruise control that uses a camera to match the speed of the car in front so you don't have to keep coming out and into cruise control. I still have the TF but, it is rare for me to only have one MG!
