

A Rare Period MG Advertisement For a MGC





Looking through my library for inspiration for this month's period MG advertisement see page 4, I became nostalgic when I found magazines with our old house addresses on the cover, ready for collection from our then local newsagents. Now of course they cascade through our letterbox at discounted prices without having to go to the newsagent. We all complain about the deterioration of our shopping centres as I do, but I suppose having stuff delivered to our houses whether from the local supermarket, Amazon or in my case magazines is not helping matters. Is this really progress?

Whilst searching around for the MG advert, I came across the magazine you see in the title. You won't see our house number on the cover of this magazine - 1935 was a little before my time! The cover is indicative of the artistry and thought that used to go into early publications. As an aside, this July 1935 edition of Speed reported on a successful month for British racing teams including MG at Brooklands and Lagonda at Le Mans.

And now during October we have had the bleating sounds of politicians stating their case at their annual conferences on how they are going to put the country to rights. And of course Rishi Sunak adding to the chaos and moving the goal posts by postponing the ban on new petrol and diesel cars and vans until 2035. We can only imagine what it was like toward the end of the 19th century when hundreds of years of the horse was going to be replaced by the horseless carriage.

Stay with me, there is a link.

Staying on the topic of magazine covers and change. Now I count myself as a crotchety old man struggling at times to adapt to a rapidly changing world - don't get me started on needing an app to park the car!! Which is why I like the work of American artist Robert Robinson who began producing humorous slice-of-life cover illustrations for the Sunday Evening Post in and around 1910. He then contributed to another American publication -*MOTOR* in 1926 until 1952 - I've chosen this cover to compare and contrast today's situation with the introduction of the electric car and the demise of the horse at the turn of the last century. It shows a farrier and his elderly crotchety pal having a laugh at one of the new fangled machines - a Duryea one of the very first automobiles sold in America.
