DRAFT CHAIRMAN'S ANNUAL REPORT

Thanks to all who have continued membership during the past year and also thank you to the potential new members who are interested in joining us when activities resume, without the enthusiasm and participation we would not have a club.

Thanks to the committee for the hard work during the past year, Terry as vice chair, Paul in his role of newsletter editor, Peter as Treasurer, Membership Secretary and Data Compliance Officer, Tom for his role as Club Secretary and Sue, Malcolm, Roger and Steve as general committee members.

Sadly in the middle of the year our longest serving committee member Vic Wright passed away after a short illness, he will be missed and remembered by all who knew him and the committee have agreed to present a new trophy in memory of Vic, this trophy will be presented for the first time in 2021.

The year started with great enthusiasm and we had many events scheduled in the diary.

In December we held our Christmas Party at the Tollgate Inn, this was a very enjoyable evening with Raffle Tickets keenly sold by Roger and the prizes sourced by Sue.

January Club night saw the "Guess what is in the Bag" challenge, which involved feeling sealed bags and then trying to identify the contents, this produced some amazing answers!

February saw our annual Valentines meal and our club night included a visit from Wiltshire Search and Rescue who told us what they do as a voluntary organisation and showed us around one of their support vehicles.

In the month of March we started our events season with a Scalextric evening organised by Roger and Lynne, this was a fantastic evening and was enjoyed by all who attended.

And then later in March came the national increase in Covid 19 cases which brought about the countrywide lockdown which as you know has completely changed the world social scene.

Despite the slight easing of restrictions we have unfortunately been forced to cancel our regular club nights, and also the many events that we had planned to either organise or attend during this year have been postponed until 2021.

In October the Castle Combe Classic Race Event was held complying with the Covid guidelines and several members attended, and the Saturday racing was held in damp conditions but after a mid morning track inspection the organisers cancelled the racing due to excessive rain on the Sunday.

The autumn committee meeting agenda included an item on how to hold the 2020 AGM, as with the national restrictions it would not be possible to hold the traditional physical AGM.

It was decided that holding the AGM on Zoom would preclude some members from participating. Rather than cancelling the AGM, a more inclusive solution was to have a virtual 2020 AGM whereby the AGM standing agenda was published in the October newsletter to include a draft response to each agenda item. Members were invited to comment on the draft, the outcomes of which formed the “proceedings” of the 2020 AGM which are published in the November edition of the newsletter.

It was decided that as there has been a lack of events during 2020 all current members will have a membership fee holiday for 2021 and will not be required to pay subscriptions, and any new member joining during the coming year will pay the pro rata fee from when we resume normal activities.

We have plans for many events in 2021 but at present cannot confirm these as it looks like the restrictions will be in place for a while yet, and we hope to be able to resume the regular club nights and events as soon as it is safe and legal to do so in 2021.

larger water splash being created by the rain at the chicane section.


